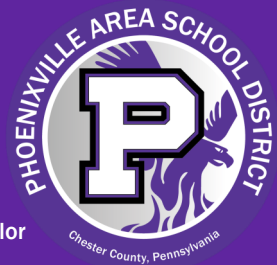

Phoenixville is a small community located 28 miles northwest of Philadelphia, adjacent to historic Valley Forge National Park. The school district encompasses 22 square miles, including the Borough of Phoenixville, East Pikeland Township and Schuylkill Township. The population is socially and economically diverse and consists of approximately 25,000 residents.

ENROLLMENT

Total enrollment at PAHS, which consists of grades 9-12 for the 2018-2019 is approximately 1,140 students with a professional staff of 91.

CURRICULUM/INSTRUCTIONAL LEVELS

Students are offered an extensive curriculum, including elective courses. An individual program is developed for each student, based on his/her ability. The average class size is approximately 25 students. All required courses are arranged by level of difficulty. Students are heterogeneously grouped in non-academic courses. The levels of courses are indicated on the transcript as follows: AP- advanced placement; H- honors; ACP- accelerated college prep, CP- college prep (phasing out) and CC- college and career ready (class of 2020 and beyond).

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

A minimum of 24 credits is required for graduation in the following subject areas:

English- 4 credits	Phys. Ed- 1 credit
Social Studies- 3 credits*	Health- 0.5 credit
