In-Person Instruction...what you need to know

- Traditional 5 day/week model
- Classrooms typical classroom setting
- Lockers and Cubbies will be accessible
- Cafeteria will be used for all lunches
- Outdoor recess without mask
- Traffic in hallways will be two-directional
- Laptops will be provided for every student (students will utilize computers in classroom for some instruction)
- NO ZOOM!!

Safety protocols

- Continue to follow guidance from Chester County Health Department
- Daily sanitizing spray of all classrooms and common areas
- Sanitizing spray after each bus run
- Masks—PASD will follow CCHD guidance
- Masks are required on buses
- If student is ill—stay home! Students can access lessons on Canvas

Technology for All

- Each student should have their own laptop/device for use in the classroom
- The PASD will provide laptops OR students have the option to bring your own technology (BYOT)
- If you choose to use a District provided laptop, there is an annual insurance fee



All – Virtual Instruction



•Commitment for the entire 2021-2022 School Year

- •Teacher assigned to Virtual classrooms—students will not interact with in-person classrooms
- •District will provide laptop for all students
- •The Educational Task Force does NOT recommend this option for our youngest students Grades K 2
- Grades 3-5 Will be a combination of synchronous (LIVE via Zoom) and asynchronous (assignments will be posted on Canvas for students to access) instruction
- Grades 6-12 Will be asynchronous instruction (assignments will be posted on Canvas for students to access on their own time schedule), with an assigned teacher as support
- •Band & Chorus will be offered in-person (secondary)
- •Students may participate in all extra-curricular activities
