Community Phoenixville is a small community located 28 miles northwest of Philadelphia, adjacent to historic Valley Forge National Park. The school district encompasses 22 square miles, including the Borough of Phoenixville, East Pikeland Township and Schuylkill Township. The population is socially and economically diverse and consists of approximately 33,000 residents.

Enrollment Total enrollment at PAHS for the 2022-2023 school year is 1276 students. The high school encompasses grades 9-12, with a professional staff of 94.

Curriculum/Instructional Levels Students are offered an extensive curriculum, including elective courses. An individual program is developed for each student, based on his/her ability. The average class size is approximately 25 students. All required courses are arranged by level of difficulty. Students are heterogeneously grouped in non-academic courses. The levels of courses are indicated on the transcript as follows: AP- advanced placement; H- honors; ACP- accelerated college prep, and CC- college and career ready.

Honors and Dual Enrollment PAHS offers 50 honors courses and 22 dual enrollment courses. The dual enrollment courses are offered through Montgomery County Community College.

Activities Over 85% of our students participate in at least one or more of the 50 clubs offered. A fully operational TV studio produces daily morning announcements, tapes all major district events, and boasts over 70 student created/produced/directed/edited videos each year.
